


FRENCH ASSEMBLY REMINDER 24th NOV. 8.50am

EDUCATIONAL NOTES

At a recent seminar discussing the findings presented at the Biennial Conference of the World Council for Gifted and Talented Children – Global Perspectives In Gifted Education, I was most interested to hear that the focus in Gifted Education has moved away from curriculum considerations and is very much focused on encouraging a 'growth mindset' in our children. There is now a great deal of evidence that emotional health/mindfulness is key to ensuring that our children develop to achieve their full potential.

After the seminar, it was lovely to hear a Quintilian parent saying that she noticed that the strategies and processes that were being introduced into other schools, as extra programs to cater for the needs of the Gifted, were what Quintilian already does as a part of our regular learning environment.

We are always looking at ways to improve, but it is nice to know that what we do at Quintilian is indeed best practice for meeting the needs of all our children.
