#### Dear Parents,

I hope your children have experienced a fabulous first few weeks of school. I have received many positive comments from parents and teachers about how well the students have settled into their new 2018 classes. Our teachers are always available to talk with parents about any matter relating to the education of your children and I encourage you to engage with them.

#### Cyber safety

This week our Years 3 to 6 students had an incursion from Life Education WA. Years 3 and 4 learnt about Cyber safety through animation, vox pops of children, relevant scenarios, discussion and problem solving. This interactive, student centred session covered:

- Building positive relationships with online and offline friends
- Safe and respectful behaviour online
- Responsible behaviours when using communication technology
- Strategies for keeping personal information safe online
- Strategies to deal with face to face and cyberbullying
- Exploring the role of bystanders

Relate, Respect, Connect was the theme for our Year 5 and 6 students. They received a unique, contemporary learning experience that explored building positive, safe and respectful relationships. The key focus areas were:

- Understanding how to respect ourselves and others
- Identifying characteristics of positive relationships
- Strategies to help maintain positive online and offline relationships
- Strategies to respond to unsafe or disrespectful situations online and offline
- The importance of relationships to our own and others wellbeing

It is essential that our upper primary students learn about Cyber Safety techniques and I am very pleased that we were able to offer this experience to our students.
