On behalf of all the Quintilian staff, we wish you all a safe and relaxing holiday, and we look forward to seeing you all next term.



WELLBEING FOCUS | HONESTY



This month's URStrong theme is HONESTY and is all about encouraging kids to "speak their truth, even if their voice shakes."



In Friendology, we teach kids to show their true colours while always being Kind-on-Purpose. Friendship Ninja's stand up for themselves by being honest about how they are feeling. Being authentic and 'true to who you are' is essential in cultivating healthy friendships.

This term, our students joined the Friends of Lake Claremont (FOLC) to support their 2025 planting season. With gloves on and spades in hand, they helped plant native seedlings to restore and protect this special wetland environment.

The activity gave students the chance to learn about conservation in a practical way. They discovered how planting native species supports biodiversity, improves soil health, and creates safe habitats for local wildlife. It also helped them understand the value of community action and environmental care.

The students showed fantastic teamwork and cooperation. They worked together, encouraged one another, and showed real pride in contributing to a meaningful cause.

FOLC is a local volunteer organisation dedicated to caring for Lake Claremont, a Bush Forever site and Conservation Category Wetland. We're proud to support their efforts and help students connect with nature and their community.

SPOTLIGHT



Our Year 3s have had a super busy term of progress, learning and most importantly, achieving their own personal bests across all areas of the curriculum.

LITERACY

Students took a deep dive into the world of creative writing, exploring how to craft vivid settings through a character's eyes, using their senses and rich descriptive language to bring scenes to life. It was wonderful to see their creativity shine! A highlight of the term was their book study of "Runt" by Craig Silvey—a heartwarming story about a girl and her extraordinary dog. The themes of friendship, resilience, and courage sparked thoughtful discussions and made for a memorable shared reading experience.

MATHS

This term's maths focus has been on multiplication, division, money and length, with students building their number fluency and applying their skills in practical ways. A standout moment was the Lego Shop activity, where students used real-world maths to "buy" and "sell" Lego pieces, practicing calculations, budgeting, and measuring in a fun, hands-on way. It's been a fantastic term of learning through doing!

SCIENCE

Our students explored the fascinating world of living things, learning how animals can be grouped based on observable features and how they differ from non-living things. Learning was topped off with a visit to Perth Zoo.



IT SKILLS

Children combined creativity with technology by designing their own Choose Your Own Adventure stories using PowerPoint. They learned how to use slide transitions, and branching pathways to create interactive narratives.

DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGIES

Students explored sustainability by creating their own mini herb gardens inside terrariums, learning about plant needs, eco-friendly design and how to repurpose materials to support growth.

HASS (Humanities and Social Sciences)

Australia and its neighbours were investigated, focusing on geography, culture and key features of the region. This project provided a fantastic journey of discovery and connection.

ART

Students explored the Dreamtime story of Tiddalik the Frog, using it as inspiration to create their own frogs from air-dried clay, developing their sculpting skills and painting techniques.





WHAT IS INQUIRY-BASED LEARNING?

Inquiry-based learning is a form of learning based solely around questioning to seek knowledge.

Learning is presented as a problem or scenario for students to solve, with student exploration at the forefront of the teaching and learning experience.

Students use open-ended questions to direct their own learning based upon their own interests.

They formulate questions, research answers to their posed questions, share their answers and new knowledge, and then reflect about the process.

Inquiry-based learning allows students to truly understand content and increase comprehension.

They are given autonomy to determine the questions about a topic they want to further

explore, enabling them to make connections and deepen their learning.

The Quintilian Way encourages curiosity and problem-solving through a holistic, integrated curriculum, that embraces an inquiry-based learning approach.

Our goal is to:

- foster a love of learning
- build strong character among our students
- encourage collaboration and communication
- connect learning to the real world

By creating an environment that supports exploration, inquiry and meaningful learning experiences, we equip our students with the tools they need to succeed in school and beyond.
