MUSIC AT QUINTILIAN

Private music tuition at Quintilian School has been growing more each year. Last year we had nearly 100 Quintilian students receiving individual music tuition each week at school. A range of wonderful performance opportunities allowed our Quintilian musicians to showcase their instrumental talents last year, giving the students something valuable to work towards in their weekly lessons. Many of our instrumental students go on to study music in high school and even beyond in courses at WAAPA and UWA.

An important feature of Quintilian music in recent years has been the added colour and vitality brought to our performances by the inclusion of many wonderful instruments. I strongly encourage any students aged 8 and above to seriously consider taking up one of the instruments that the orchestras are always looking for; flute, trumpet, clarinet and saxophone. Violin and Cello can be started at an earlier age. Piano, drums, guitar and singing lessons are always popular choices. Lessons take place during the school day on a rotating basis and are booked directly with the teacher concerned, I can put you in touch on request. CHOOSING AN INSTRUMENT

Wind instruments – Brendan Scott-Grey

For primary school students, they are great to learn as they are very versatile and can be played in concert bands, jazz groups, and orchestras.

Flute – can be started from Year 3

Clarinet – from Year 3 or 4 onwards.

Saxophone – generally from Year 4 upwards. Both a jazz and a classical instrument.

<u>Orchestral Strings</u> – Violin (On The Run Music) and Cello (subject to sufficient numbers of new students)

Because these instruments come in graded sizes, they can be started at a very early age (as young as 3 years old), though it is never too late to start! These are great choices for sociable, musical students who will enjoy playing alongside others in ensembles and orchestras.

<u>Piano</u> – (Natalie Peters and Debbie Young) Always a popular choice, the piano can be started in Year 1 or 2, though older beginners do just as well. Many young pianists take up an additional ensemble instrument later on and make rapid progress, having learnt basic musical skills through keyboard or piano.

<u>Drum Kit</u> – (Ian Ironside) A popular choice for those with good coordination, stamina and sense of rhythm.

<u>Guitar</u> (rock and/or classical) and <u>Singing</u> (contemporary style) and <u>Violin</u> are led by various teachers and co-ordinated by On The Run Music (Michael Basham). Please visit http://www.ontherunmusic.com.au


There is lots to entertain so bring along your family and friends and relax while the kids enjoy the
