Well done to all for getting involved and giving every event your best shot.







MEET THE TEACHER

Q: How long have you taught at Quintilian?

A: I've been teaching at Quintilian for almost 4 years – time flies! In 2021 I taught Year 3 and have been in Year 5 ever since.


Q: What does fun mean to you and how do you see this show up in Quintilian students?

A: To me, fun means doing things that bring happiness and help you forget about any worries. It's about laughing with friends and family, trying new things, and savouring the little moments in life.

Quintilian kids embody the spirit of fun—they create games that transport us to new worlds, make up songs, dances, and plays, and are always ready for an exciting story filled with laughter. Being a teacher here definitely keeps the joy and love of fun alive within us as adults. Not a day goes by without plenty of fun to be had

Q: What's one thing your students would be surprised to learn about you?

A: When I was in primary school, I always wanted to be a vet when I grew up. However, my fear of birds quickly took that away!



Q: If you could take your students on an excursion anywhere in the world, where would you go and what would you hope they'd learn?

A: If it wasn't so far away, it would definitely be to see the Northern Lights, (aurora borealis). There is so much learning the children could gain, from Science and Mythology to Sustainable Tourism and Art.

Q: Do you speak any foreign languages? If so, which ones?

A: I speak English and French, as both my parents are from France, but if I were to learn another language it would definitely be Spanish.

Q: How do you like to spend your weekends or downtime outside of school?

A: You'll usually find me at the cinema, reading a good book or eating delicious food. I spend as much time as possible with family and friends too.





Q: How long have you taught at Quintilian?

A: This is my second year at Quintilian. My first year was really exciting as we had a production, and I'm looking forward to having one next year!

Q: What does fun mean to you and how do you see this show up in Quintilian students?

A: To me "fun" means engaging students in a way that sparks curiosity, creativity, and enjoyment in learning. It's about creating experiences where students feel motivated and connected to the material, making the content hands-on and relevant to their lives.

Q: If you weren't a teacher, what career do you think you'd have pursued?

A: I have always wanted to play the piano well. To me, playing an instrument is the closest form of magic: an object made of metal and wood when, in skillful hands, evokes emotions and takes us to places or down memory lane. So, in an alternate world I would have become a concert pianist.

Q: If your life had a theme song, what would it be?

A: I enjoy grand and dramatic music, which has a powerful, intense feel that immediately pulls you in and makes you feel like something epic is about to happen. A great example is Rachmaninoff's Piano Concerto No. 2, 1st movement.

Q: What's your favourite instrument?

A: The piano is my favourite instrument as it's like having a whole orchestra at your fingertips. It has a huge range, from the deep, resonant bass notes to bright, sparkling high notes. It can be delicate or powerful, gentle or thunderous. Apart from that, it is very versatile - it fits into almost every genre, from classical to jazz, to rock.

Q: If you could have dinner with a famous composer, who would you choose and why?

A: I think I'd pick Ludwig van Beethoven. He was such a bold, innovative force in music, especially in the way he broke the rules and pushed beyond the conventions of his time. He struggled with hearing loss, yet continued composing some of the most emotionally powerful and revolutionary music ever written. I'd love to hear him talk about his inspirations, how he felt about his music and how he managed to stay dedicated despite the challenges he faced. Plus, he had a fiery personality, so I imagine the conversation would be anything but boring!

Donate to "Give Write"


"Give Write" takes donations of new and pre-loved stationery to repackage and redistribute to students in need, allowing them to engage with their education and feel inspired to learn.
