WELLBEING FOCUS

This month, our students have been reflecting on the importance of forgiveness in friendships. But, what exactly is forgiveness?

Children sometimes get stuck at this step because they are so focused on being right. When something feels unfair or trust & respect are broken, it can often be hard to move forward on the Friend-o-cycle.

This is where we focus on Friendship Fact #1: No friendship (or relationship) is perfect. Forgiveness is about 'letting go' and moving forward in a friendship - the Forgive & Forget phase on the Friend-o-Cycle.

Children are reminded that we can only get to Forgive & Forget if we "Talk-it-Out until the Fire-is-Out". Once we've done that, then we can let it go and move on.

So how do we do that?

LEARNING TO TALK-IT-OUT!

- 1. Find a good time to talk, just the two of you.
- 2. In a calm, serious voice, retell the situation.
- 3. Explain how it made you feel.
- 4. Listen to their side and truly try to understand their perspective.

Before embarking on their Kimberley camp last term, our Year 6 cohort undertook a number of preparation sessions with Andrew and his team from Adventure Education WA.

Whilst the students did learn how to pitch and pack away a tent, they also gained invaluable lifelong skills to facilitate growth, challenge and connection, including setting themselves a personal goal to achieve at camp.

During their final session with Andrew, each Year 6 student brought along the visual representation of their goal, which they had created on wooden boards, and readied for their Board Breaking Ceremony. As a symbol of breaking through their comfort zones through self belief, resilience and grit, each student stood in the centre of a circle of their peers and "smashed through" their fears.

Empathy in Action

Throughout the year, the Sheddies have been on a powerful journey of learning how to resolve conflicts peacefully and deepen their understanding of emotions. They've explored how their words and actions affect others and practised showing kindness and care in meaningful ways. A central theme has been empathy; what it looks like, sounds like, and, most importantly, feels like in practice.

A beautiful moment of this learning came to life when Clare had a sore foot. Rather than just asking if she was okay, the children responded with real empathy - bringing her cushions and offering comfort. It was a moment that demonstrated how empathy had become more than a concept; it had become part of who they are.

Then, something truly special happened. As we passed by "The Tree that Needed Kindness", Georgie paused and said, "The tree that we hurt needs a bandage like Clare's foot." This simple yet profound observation sparked a shared sense of responsibility and compassion.

The children immediately began brainstorming how they could help the tree feel better. Inspired by Georgie's insight, we collaborated on a beautiful piece of artwork which we will wrap around the tree like a healing bandage.

This project has been a wonderful reminder that children don't just understand empathy - they live it. When given the chance to pause, listen and care they show us how to build a kinder, more thoughtful world.

The Magic of Clay

This term, the Sheddies have been diving hands-first into the wonderful, squishy world of clay and it's been pure magic! They've discovered that clay can be hard and cold one moment, then "squelchy welchy," "squishy wishy," and "slippery pippery" the next, just by adding a splash of water.

We noticed how much the Sheddies loved sticking things into the clay; feathers, sticks, buttons, and more.

That spark of curiosity led us to start making our own clay creations with each Sheddie bringing their own ideas to life, showing just how magical clay can be when little hands and big imaginations get to work.



















BIKE SAFETY WITH AUSBIKE

This term, our Year 4 students have been taking part in the AusBike bike safety program, which focuses on developing essential skills, safety and confidence with cycling.

The children have been working their way through a number of core bike skills aimed at embedding the fundamentals over a series of four one-hour sessions. Road safety smarts and some bike maintenance tips have also been covered in the program.

The students learnt the A-B-C-D-E bike check method to ensure their bike is safe to ride:

A is for AIR

B is for BRAKES

C is for CHAIN

D is for DROP

E is for END PLUGS


